Things to Know Before You Adopt:

- If you are adopting a dog as a gift, please insure that the recipient wants the pet and is willing to care for it. Pets do not make good surprises.
- Pets are best suited to live inside with your family. If you intend to keep your pet primarily outside, it must have suitable shelter from the elements and daily human interaction. Your new pet will need daily care, including good quality pet food, fresh water, clean bedding, and human interaction.
- A pet is a commitment for the lifetime of the pet. All pets can develop problem behaviors. You must commit to work through problems with positive training techniques. You can contact us for assistance or referral to a professional pet trainer.
- Pets are expensive. You must be ready to purchase food, supplies, and veterinary care. Both dogs and cats need annual vaccinations and veterinary exams as well as care if they become sick or injured. Dogs need monthly heartworm prevention. Dogs and cats need regular parasite prevention for fleas, ticks, and intestinal parasites.
- Dogs should not be chained or tethered. You need a good quality fence or the willingness to walk your dog at least twice daily.
- Many rentals do not accept pets. If you rent your residence, please insure that your landlord will allow you to own a dog – some landlords have breed restrictions.
- All animals adopted out through the SPCA will need to be microchipped. If your animal is not microchipped on the day you pick up, you MUST schedule a time within two-weeks for this very simple procedure. A microchip permanently identifies your pet and helps you become reunited with your pet if he or she is ever lost or stolen. We can implant your pet with a microchip before he or she goes home today for an additional \$20.
- If your pet has already received a rabies vaccination, there will be an additional \$15 fee added to your adoption fee today.
- If your pet is not yet spayed or neutered, there will be an additional \$100.00 refundable deposit today.
- Shelter pets have uncertain backgrounds. The SPCA-BC/SBCAS does not make any representations as to the age, breed, background, or health status of your pet. Certain health conditions are likely to be present in your pet including, but not limited to, internal and external parasites, upper respiratory tract infections, and gastro-intestinal distress. The SPCA-BC/SBCAS does not have a veterinarian on staff, so your pet has not received a veterinary exam while residing at the shelter. We recommend that you keep your new pet segregated from any pets who already reside in your home until you are able to have your new pet examined by a veterinarian.
- **Pursuant to Texas Health & Safety Code, Title 10, Chapter 828, your newly-adopted pet must be sterilized (spayed or neutered) no later than the 30th day after the date of adoption of an adult animal, or the 30th day after an infant animal is estimated to have obtained the age of four months. Failure to sterilize your pet is a criminal offense punishable as a Class C misdemeanor.**
